GENERAL RULES ABOUT USING THIS CALENDAR

DATES IN THIS CALENDAR ARE SUBJECT TO CHANGE BY THE 2010 SESSION OF THE INDIANA GENERAL ASSEMBLY

This publication lists election dates from December 2009 through January 2011. The Indiana Code ("IC") citations included in this publication are current as of November 30, 2009.

If an election law specifies a final date for a particular filing, but no final hour of that day, the final hour for filing is **NOON**, prevailing local time (IC 3-5-4-1). Every date appearing in this calendar must be read as having a **noon deadline** for the filing, unless another time is specifically stated. See also IC 3-5-2-24.5 to determine when a "filing" is considered completed.

A legal action required to be taken at state offices on a day when **state** offices are closed may be taken on the next following workday (IC 4-1-2-2).

Whenever the election code requires that a legal action be taken at the office of a circuit court clerk or a political subdivision, and the final day for performing the action falls on a day when the office is not open to conduct public business (or the office is open, but it is a state holiday under IC 1-1-9), the legal action may be performed on the next day that the office is open for public business OR if the action to be performed is receiving a filing, through noon of the next day that the office is open for public business (IC 3-5-4-1.5).

However, this rule does **not apply** to a legal action that must taken by an individual or organization which is not a government office or an officer of a political subdivision, such as the county chairman of a political party, or a meeting of the county organization of a political party. These legal actions must be taken no later than the date and time specified, even if the deadline falls on a Saturday, Sunday, or other holiday under IC 1-1-9.

A "county voter registration office" refers to a circuit court clerk, a board of registration, the Lake County board of elections and registration, or the Tippecanoe County board of elections and registration (IC 3-5-2-16.2).

In 2010, Indiana voters will elect individuals to serve in the following offices:

- 1. U.S. Senate (1 seat)
- 2. Secretary of State of Indiana*
- 3. Auditor of State of Indiana*
- 4. Treasurer of State of Indiana*
- 5. United States House of Representatives (all 9 seats)
- 6. Indiana State Senate (25 of 50 Districts, namely: 1, 4, 6, 11, 14, 15, 17, 19, 21, 22, 23, 25, 26, 27, 29, 31, 38, 39, 41, 43, 45, 46, 47, 48 and 49)
- 7. Indiana House of Representatives (all 100 seats)
- 8. Judges of circuit and superior court in several counties
- 9. Prosecuting Attorney and Sheriff in each county
- 10. Clerks of the Circuit Court, County Auditors, County Recorders, County Treasurers, County Coroners, County Surveyors, County Assessors, County Commissioners and County Council Members in several counties
- 11. Township offices (Assessor, in some townships; Trustee; and some Township Board members)
- 12. Town Council members, town clerk-treasurers and town judges in certain towns which have chosen to elect some or all town officials during 2010
- 13. Voters will vote on the retention of judges of the Indiana Court of Appeals and local judges and on any local public question placed on the ballot in accordance with state law
- 14. School board members, elected by voters in several school corporations in either the primary or general election
- 15. Democratic and Republican Party state convention delegates elected at the primary election
- 16. Democratic Party precinct committeemen elected at the primary election

CALENDAR DESIGNATIONS

The following designations are used throughout this publication to indicate the nature of certain filing dates and deadlines:

ABS Indicates dates associated with absentee ballots.

CFA Indicates dates associated with campaign finance.

CAN Indicates dates associated with candidates.

FORMS

Where applicable, following the Indiana Code citation at the end of a calendar entry is a reference to the relevant Indiana state form. For example: Wednesday, January 20, 2010 is the first day an individual may file a declaration of candidacy for primary nomination. The state form for this filing is the CAN-2 form.

NOTE: IC 3-5-4-8 provides, in relevant part:

^{*} The major political parties will nominate their candidates for Secretary of State, Auditor, and Treasurer at their respective state conventions.

"Except as provided in subsection (e) [which concerns certain voter registration forms]... a person must use the most recent version of the form approved by the [Indiana Election] Commission to comply with [the election law]..."

If you are uncertain whether you have the most recent version of an approved form, contact the Indiana Election Division for information.

NOTE: IC 3-5-4-1.7 provides:

"Except as otherwise expressly authorized or required under [the Indiana Election Code], a filing by a person with a commission, the election division, or an election board may not be made by fax or electronic mail."

There are some exceptions to this general rule involving campaign finance filings. If you are uncertain whether a filing may be made by fax or electronic mail, contact the Indiana Election Division for information.

NOTE: IC 3-5-4-1.9 provides:

"Except as otherwise provided in [the election code], the election division, an election board, a circuit court clerk, a county voter registration office, or any other official responsible for receiving a filing under this title may not receive a filing that is offered to be filed after a deadline for the filing provided by [the Indiana Election Code]."

There are some exceptions to this general rule involving campaign finance filings and voter registration applications. If you are uncertain whether a filing may be made after a deadline provided in statute, contact the Indiana Election Division for information.

DECEMBER 2009

Tuesday, December 1, 2009

Voter Registration Period Begins (IC 3-7-13-10)

2010 Indiana Election Administrator's Conference Convenes (December 1-2, 2009).

First day that the Indiana election division, a county election board, or the Lake County and Tippecanoe boards of elections and registration are not required to retain campaign finance reports pertaining to elections in 2005 and previous years, except for candidates' committees of candidates for judicial offices. (IC 3-9-4-6)

First day that a county election board or the Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration are not required to retain campaign finance reports filed in by candidates' committees of candidates for local judicial offices for elections in 2003 and previous years. (IC 3-9-4-6)

Thursday, December 31, 2009

CFA End of annual campaign finance reporting period for 2009. (IC 3-9-5-9; IC 3-9-5-10)

A resolution adopted by a county election board to omit the appointment of poll clerks and sheriffs in certain precincts expires. (IC 3-6-6-38)

DEADLINE, by noon, for county committees of a major political party to file descriptions setting forth district boundaries of state convention delegate districts with a county election board or the Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration for state convention delegates that will be elected in the 2010 primary. If the county committee does not timely file district descriptions by this date then the county election board shall establish state convention delegate districts not later than January 20, 2010. (IC 3-8-4-3(d))

DEADLINE for a town council in a town that elects town council members in 2010 to adopt an ordinance abolishing town legislative body districts. (IC 36-5-2-4.1)

DEADLINE for a town council in a town with a population of less than 3,500 to adopt, or repeal, an ordinance to provide for the election of town legislative body members, town clerk-treasurer, and town judge to be held during general elections or municipal elections, or both. An ordinance may not provide for this election to occur in a year following a presidential election (2013, for example). The ordinance must provide that at least two (2) town officers shall be elected in each year of the town election cycle. The ordinance may provide for all town officers to be elected at the same election. If an ordinance is adopted, it may not be repealed earlier than twelve (12) years after its adoption and the ordinance may be repealed only in a year preceding a municipal election held at the time described in IC 3-10-6-5. (IC 3-10-7-2.9)

JANUARY 2010

Friday, January 1, 2010

NEW YEAR'S DAY HOLIDAY Indiana election division closed

CFA Beginning of 2010 campaign finance reporting periods. (IC 3-9-5-10)

First day of term for an individual appointed as a member of a county board of voter registration. (IC 3-7-12-10)

DEADLINE for a town council in a town with a population of less than 3,500 to adopt an ordinance providing for a town primary for major party candidates in 2010 for towns that elect some town offices in 2010 (otherwise major party candidates will nominate their candidates in a town convention). (IC 3-8-5-2)

Monday, January 4, 2010

CAN First day a major party candidate for U.S. Senate may file a petition of nomination with a county voter registration office for verification of petition signatures. (Transferred from Friday, January 1; IC 3-8-2-10; IC 3-8-3-4) STATE FORM: CAN-4 (U.S. Senate)

CAN First day a minor party candidate (other than a Libertarian Party candidate) or an independent candidate wishing to be placed on the 2010 general election ballot may file a petition of nomination with a county voter registration office for verification of petition signatures. (Transferred from Friday, January 1; IC 3-8-6-10) STATE FORM: CAN-19

CAN First day a Democratic Party, Libertarian Party, or Republican Party candidate may file a declaration of candidacy for nomination to a town office in 2010 at a town convention in a small town (less than 3,500 in population) that elects some or all town offices in 2010. This does not apply to major party candidates (candidates of the Democratic or Republican Party) in a small town that has adopted an ordinance to nominate major party candidates in a primary. (Transferred from Friday, January 1; IC 3-8-5-10.5; IC 3-8-5-17; IC 3-10-7-2.7; IC 3-10-7-2.9) **STATE FORM: CAN-16**

CAN First day for a person to file a declaration of intent to be a write-in candidate with the Indiana election division or a county election board or the Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration. The name of a write-in candidate may **not** be placed on the primary or general ballot. (Note: Write-in candidates may not run in the primary to be nominated as a major party candidate, however, a write-in candidate may run in the primary to be elected as a school board member if the school board election is scheduled to occur during the primary). (Transferred from Friday, January 1; IC 3-8-2-2.5; IC 3-8-2-2.6; IC 3-8-2-4; IC 3-8-2-5; IC 3-11-4-15; IC 3-11-2-11.5) **STATE FORM: CAN-3**

CAN First day for an individual to file a declaration of intent to be a write-in candidate for a school board office elected in the 2010 primary election. (Transferred from Friday, January 1; IC 3-8-2-2.6) **STATE FORM: CAN-13**

First day that the Indiana election division may discard duplicate copies of federal campaign finance reports filed in 2007. (Transferred from Friday, January 1; IC 3-9-4-6 (c), IC 3-9-5-13)

Monday, January 4, 2010 (continued)

A person may file a civil action alleging a violation of NVRA if: (1) the violation is not corrected within 30 days after the co-directors of the Indiana election division receive notice of the violation; and (2) the violation occurs not later than this date (120 days before the primary election). (IC 3-7-11-14)

Monday, January 11, 2010

DEADLINE for the Indiana general assembly to reconvene for the 2010 regular session. (IC 2-2.1-1-2(d))

Monday, January 18, 2010 MARTIN LUTHER KING DAY Indiana Election Division closed

Tuesday, January 19, 2010

DEADLINE for a precinct establishment order to become effective. The next date that a precinct establishment order may take effect after this date is November 4, 2010. (IC 3-11-1.5-25).

Wednesday, January 20, 2010

- CFA DEADLINE, by noon prevailing local time, for all candidate committees, all legislative caucus committees, and all political action committees to file the 2009 annual campaign finance report with the Indiana election division, a county election board, or the Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration. A candidate's committee of a candidate for state legislative office is required to file with both the Indiana election division and with the county election board in the county where the candidate resides. (IC 3-9-5-3; IC 3-9-5-10) STATE FORM: CFA-4
- CFA DEADLINE, by noon, prevailing local time, for a candidate's committee of a candidate for a statewide office not on the 2010 general election ballot, to file a **semiannual** campaign finance report with the Indiana election division covering the period from July 1 through December 31, 2009. (IC 3-9-5-9) **STATE FORM: CFA-4**
- CAN First day an individual may file with the secretary of state or the Indiana election division a petition for placement on the 2010 primary election ballot as a major party candidate for United States Senator following certification of petition signatures by county voter registration offices. The declaration of candidacy must accompany the petition. (IC 3-8-2-8) STATE FORM: CAN-4 (petition), CAN-2 (declaration of candidacy)
- CAN First day an individual may file a declaration of candidacy with the secretary of state as a major party candidate for nomination in the 2010 primary for federal office, state legislative office, judicial office, or for prosecuting attorney. (IC 3-8-2-4; IC 3-8-2-5) **STATE FORM:** CAN-2

(Note: Although IC 3-8-2-5 requires a declaration of candidacy for these offices to be filed with the secretary of state, IC 3-8-2-11 provides that a declaration is not valid unless received in the office of the election division, a division of the office of secretary of state).

Wednesday, January 20, 2010 (continued)

- CAN First day an individual may file with the Indiana election division a declaration of candidacy for election to the Allen County superior court or the Vanderburgh County superior court at the 2010 general election. (IC 3-8-2-4; IC 33-33-2-9) **STATE FORM: CAN-41**
- CAN First day an individual may file a declaration of candidacy with a county election board or the Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration for nomination as a major party candidate to a local office (except candidates for the offices of judge or prosecuting attorney who file with the Indiana election division) at the 2010 primary election. This declaration must be filed in the office of the county election board. (IC 3-8-2-4; IC 3-8-2-6) **STATE FORM: CAN-2**
- CAN First day an individual may file a declaration of candidacy with a county election board or the Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration for the nomination for a town office for a major party in a town with a population of less than 3,500 that has adopted an ordinance to nominate major party candidates in a primary election and has all or some of its offices on the ballot in 2010. This declaration must be filed in the office of the county election board located in the county seat. (IC 3-8-5-2; IC 3-8-2-4; IC 3-8-2-6) STATE FORM: CAN-2
- CAN First day an individual may file a petition of nomination with a county election board or the Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration for election as a school board member at the 2010 primary election. This declaration must be filed in the office of the county election board located in the county seat of the county containing the greatest percentage of population of the school district. (IC 3-8-2-4; IC 20-23-4-29; IC 20-23-12-5; IC 20-23-14-5) **STATE FORM: CAN-34**
- CAN First day an individual may file a declaration of candidacy with a county election board or the Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration for election as a major party state convention delegate at the 2010 primary election. (IC 3-10-1-4(b)(2); IC 3-8-2-3; IC 3-8-2-4; IC 3-8-2-6) **STATE FORM: CAN-37**
- CAN First day an individual may file a declaration of candidacy with a county election board or the Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration for election as a Democratic Party precinct committeeman. (IC 3-10-1-4.6; IC 3-8-2-3; IC 3-8-2-4; IC 3-8-2-6) STATE FORM: CAN-37
- CAN **DEADLINE**, for a county election board to establish political party state convention delegate districts and apportion the delegates to be elected from each district (*if the political party's county committee did not file descriptions of delegate district boundaries with the county election board by noon, December 31, 2009). (IC 3-8-4-3(d))*

Friday, January 29, 2010

CFA DEADLINE, for the Indiana election division, a county election board, or the Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration to review its campaign finance records to determine if a committee is subject to the administrative dissolution procedure. (IC 3-9-1-12)

FEBRUARY 2010

Monday, February 1, 2010

DEADLINE for each county sheriff to provide the county voter registration office with a list of each Indiana resident who has been convicted of a crime and had been placed in a county correctional facility during the previous quarter. (*Transferred from Sunday, January 31*; IC 3-7-46-6)

Wednesday, February 3, 2010

ABS First day the circuit court clerk or Lake and Tippecanoe County election boards may receive absentee ballot applications from most voters. (IC 3-11-4-3)

Tuesday, February 16, 2010

CAN **DEADLINE**, by noon, for a major party candidate for U.S. Senate to file a petition of nomination with a county voter registration office for verification of petition signatures. (IC 3-8-2-10) **STATE FORM: CAN-4**

Friday, February 19, 2010

- CAN **DEADLINE**, by noon, for major party candidate for U.S. Senate to file a petition for placement on the 2010 primary election ballot with the secretary of state following certification of petition signatures by county voter registration offices. A declaration of candidacy must accompany the petition for the office of U.S. Senate. (IC 3-8-2-4; IC 3-8-2-5; IC 3-8-2-8) **STATE FORMS: CAN-4 and CAN-2**
- CAN **DEADLINE**, by noon, Indianapolis time, for major party candidate for U.S. Representative, state legislative office, judicial office, or prosecuting attorney to file a declaration of candidacy with the election division for the 2010 primary election. (IC 3-8-2-4; IC 3-8-2-6) **STATE FORM: CAN-2**
- CAN **DEADLINE**, by noon, prevailing local time, for major party candidates for all local offices (except candidates for the offices of judge or prosecuting attorney who file with the Indiana election division) to file a declaration of candidacy with the county election board or the Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration for the 2010 primary election. (IC 3-8-2-4; IC 3-8-2-6) **STATE FORM: CAN-2**
- CAN **DEADLINE**, by noon prevailing local time, for an individual to file a petition of nomination with a county election board or the Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration for election as a school board member at the 2010 primary election. This declaration must be filed in the office of the county election board located in the county seat of the county containing the greatest percentage of population of the school corporation. (IC 3-8-2-4; IC 20-23-4-29; IC 20-23-12-5, and IC 20-23-14-5) **STATE FORM: CAN-34**

Friday, February 19, 2010 (continued)

- CAN **DEADLINE**, by noon, for an individual to file a declaration of intent to be a write-in candidate for school board elected in the 2010 primary election. (IC 3-8-2-2.6) **STATE FORM: CAN-13**
- CAN DEADLINE, by noon, prevailing local time, for an individual to file a declaration of candidacy with a county election board or the Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration for nomination to a **town office** by a major political party for towns with a population of less than 3,500 that elect some town council members at 2010 general election and that have adopted an ordinance to nominate candidates for town offices at the primary election. This declaration must be filed in the office of the county election board located in the county seat of the county containing the greatest percentage of population of the town. (IC 3-8-2-4; IC 3-8-2-6; IC 3-8-5-2) **STATE FORM: CAN-2**
- CAN **DEADLINE**, by noon, for an individual to file a declaration of candidacy with a county election board or the Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration for election as a major party state convention delegate in the 2010 primary. (IC 3-10-1-4(b)(2); IC 3-8-2-3; IC 3-8-2-4; IC 3-8-2-6) **STATE FORM: CAN-37**
- CAN **DEADLINE**, by noon, for an individual to file a declaration of candidacy with a county election board or the Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration for election as a Democratic Party precinct committeemen in the 2010 primary. (IC 3-10-1-4.6; IC 3-8-2-3; IC 3-8-2-4; IC 3-8-2-6) **STATE FORM: CAN-37**

Immediately after the deadline for filing as a candidate for placement on the primary election ballot, the Indiana election division, each circuit court clerk and the Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration shall certify and release to the public a list of candidates of each political party for each office. The Indiana election division, circuit court clerk, and Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration shall also release to the public a list of all declarations of candidacy whose validity has been questioned under IC 3-8-1-2. (IC 3-8-2-13) **STATE FORM: CAN-6**

Monday, February 22, 2010

CAN **DEADLINE**, by noon, prevailing local time, for an individual to **withdraw** a declaration of candidacy or a request for ballot placement for the primary or to withdraw a petition to be a candidate for school board or a declaration to be a write-in candidate for school board. (IC 3-8-2-20; IC 3-8-2-2.6(d)) **STATE FORM: CAN-10**

Tuesday, February 23, 2010

First day that the proprietor or manager of a residential facility (other than a mental health facility) must maintain a list of residents for use by poll takers in the primary election. (IC 3-6-11-5)

Friday, February 26, 2010

- CAN **DEADLINE**, by noon, for filing a statement questioning the validity of a declaration of candidacy for nomination in the 2010 primary with the Indiana election division, circuit court clerk or Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration. (IC 3-8-2-14) **STATE FORM: CAN-1**
- CAN **DEADLINE**, by noon, for filing a statement questioning the validity of a petition of nomination of a candidate for school board in the 2010 primary election with the circuit court clerk or Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration. (IC 3-8-2-14) **STATE FORM: CAN-1**
- CAN **DEADLINE**, by noon, for filing a statement questioning the validity of a declaration of candidacy of a write-in candidate for school board in the 2010 primary election with the circuit court clerk or Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration. (IC 3-8-2-2.6(e)) **STATE FORM: CAN-1**
- **CFA**DEADLINE, by noon prevailing local time, for a candidate who filed a declaration of candidacy for the primary election to file a campaign finance statement of organization with the Indiana election division, a county election board, or the Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration (unless the candidate was already required to do so after raising or spending more than \$100). Candidates for local office with compensation of less than \$5,000 and candidates for school board are not required to file a statement of organization unless they raise or spend more than \$500. If they raise or spend more than \$500 then they must file a statement of organization by noon 10 days from the date of raising or spending more than \$500. (IC 3-9-1-5; IC 3-9-1-5.5) **STATE FORM: CFA-1**
- CAN **DEADLINE**, by noon, for an appointed member of a county election board affiliated with a major political party to file a statement with the circuit court clerk or Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration stating that the names of unopposed candidates of that political party for precinct committeemen and state convention delegate are to be printed on the party's primary election ballot. (IC 3-10-1-5)

MARCH 2010

Monday, March 1, 2010

CFA DEADLINE, by noon, prevailing local time, for all regular party committees to file the 2009 annual campaign finance report with the Indiana election division, a county election board, or the Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration. This deadline applies whether the report was hand-delivered, sent by U.S. mail, or otherwise delivered to the division or board. (IC 3-9-5-10) STATE FORM: CFA-4

First day of the period that the county voter registration office must begin providing copies of memoranda showing all original voter registrations and transfers occurring after this date and ending 29 days before the primary election. Copies of the memoranda must be provided within 48 hours after the making of the memoranda. The memoranda must be provided, upon request, to a major party county chairman, a chairman of a bona fide political party, or to an independent candidate's committee if the independent candidate is on the ballot. (*Transferred from Sunday, February 28*; IC 3-7-28-2; IC 3-7-28-3; IC 3-7-28-4) See March 5 for related entry for providing copies of all registration applications prior to February 28.

Thursday, March 4, 2010

DEADLINE for the board of commissioners of a county with a population of less than 125,000 to adopt an order establishing a county board of registration with immediate authority to administer voter registration within the county. An order adopted after this date and before the primary becomes effective on the day following the primary. (IC 3-7-12-5)

DEADLINE for a county election board or the Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration to rescind any previously adopted resolution before the 2010 primary providing that absentee ballots to be voted before a traveling absentee board are to be initialed by the county election board or board of elections and registration (and not initialed by the traveling board visiting the voter). (IC 3-11-10-27)

Friday, March 5, 2010

- CAN **DEADLINE** for the Indiana election division to transmit to each county election board and the Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration a certified list containing the name of each person for whom a declaration of candidacy has been filed with the Indiana election division. (IC 3-8-2-17)
- ABS **DEADLINE** for a county election board or the Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration to adopt a resolution before the 2010 primary providing for the **central count of absentee ballots** within the county. (IC 3-11.5-5-1; IC 3-11.5-6-1)
- CFA DEADLINE, by noon, for the Indiana election division, a county election board, or the Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration to determine if a candidate who has filed a declaration of candidacy for the primary election has filed a campaign finance statement of organization for the candidate's committee. (IC 3-8-1-1.6)

Friday, March 5, 2010 (continued)

DEADLINE for the circuit court clerk or Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration to estimate the number of absentee ballots and provisional ballots required in the county for the 2010 primary election. After the estimate is made, the county election board or Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration must begin to print the absentee ballots. (IC 3-11-4-10; IC 3-11-4-14; IC 3-11.7-1-4)

DEADLINE by noon, for a local public question to be certified to the circuit court clerk or the Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration for placement on the 2010 primary election ballot. (IC 3-10-9-3)

However, in a county with a population of less than 20,000, the absentee voter board in the office of the circuit court clerk, after majority vote by the county election board, may reduce absentee voting hours to a minimum of four (4) hours on this date. (IC 3-11-10-26)

DEADLINE, for the county executive or Mayor of Indianapolis to change the polling place for a precinct in the county. However, if the county election board or Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration determine by a unanimous vote that the use of a polling place at an election would be dangerous or impossible, the board may order the relocation of the polling place after this date. The board shall give the best possible notice of the change to news media and the voters of the precinct. (IC 3-11-8-3.2)

First day that an inspector or other authorized member of the precinct election board may pick up ballots and election supplies for the inspector's precinct. (IC 3-11-3-10)

Sunday, May 2, 2010

CFA 6 a.m., end of the pre-primary supplemental campaign finance reporting period for candidates on the primary ballot (*this does not apply to candidates for statewide office*). Contributions from a person that total \$1,000 or more received by a candidate on the primary election ballot after that time must be reported on the committee's pre-general election campaign finance report. (IC 3-9-5-20.1)

DEADLINE for a precinct inspector or other authorized member of the precinct election board to pick up ballots and election supplies for the inspector's precinct. (IC 3-11-3-10)

DEADLINE, in an absentee ballot central count county for the circuit court clerk or the Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of election and registration to provide a certificate to inspectors stating the names of the voters: (1) to whom absentee ballots were sent or who marked ballots in person; and (2) whose ballots have been received by the county election board under IC 3-11-10. (IC 3-11.5-4-1)

ABS **DEADLINE**, by noon, for the circuit court clerk or Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration to receive a mailed, faxed, or hand delivered absentee ballot application from a voter with disabilities, a confined voter, or a voter caring for a confined person that requests that the absentee ballots be delivered to the applicant by an absentee travel board. (IC 3-11-4-3(3); IC 3-11-10-25)

Monday, May 3, 2010 (continued)

- ABS **DEADLINE** (by midnight), for a voter with disabilities, a confined voter, or a voter caring for a confined person that requests that the absentee ballots be delivered to the applicant by an absentee travel board to vote an absentee ballot before an absentee travel board at the voter's location. (IC 3-11-10-25)
- ABS **DEADLINE**, by noon, for the circuit court clerk or Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration to receive an absentee ballot application from a military or overseas voter who is entitled to return a voted ballot by fax. (IC 3-11-4-3(2))

DEADLINE, by noon, for the county chairmen of the two major political parties to make a written recommendation to the county election board for the appointment of individuals as provisional ballot counters. If a county chairman fails to make a recommendation, the county lection board may appoint any voter of the county. (*Transferred from Saturday, May 1;* IC 3-11.7-3-4; IC 3-11.7-4-5)

DEADLINE, by 4 p.m., for a voter who has moved to a different precinct in Indiana not more than 30 days before the primary election, to execute a transfer request for the voter's registration in the county voter registration office. This transfer allows the voter to return to the voter's old precinct and vote at that location one final time. (IC 3-10-11-7) **STATE FORM: VRG-4/12**

DEADLINE, by 6 p.m., for a county election board or the Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registrations to deliver the voting system and equipment to each polling place. In precincts using computerized electronic voting systems, the county election board shall have the system put in order, set and adjusted, and ready for use in voting. (IC 3-11-11-1.8; IC 3-11-13-6; IC 3-11-14-13)

DEADLINE for a county election board to conduct a training and educational meeting for inspectors, judges, poll clerks, assistant poll clerks, and sheriffs. Inspectors must attend this meeting. The county election board may require other precinct election officers to attend as well. In a precinct using an electronic voting system, each precinct election board must: (1) compare the ballot label on each electronic voting system with the sample ballot to see that it is correct; (2) see that the system records zero (0) votes for each candidate and on each public question; and (3) see that the system is otherwise in perfect order before the polls open. The board then shall certify that the ballot labels and the sample ballots are in agreement. (IC 3-11-14-13; IC 3-11-14-17)

In a precinct using an optical scan ballot card voting system, the precinct election board must (1) compare the ballot cards used in the marking device with the sample ballots furnished and determine whether the names, numbers, and letters are in agreement; (2) see that the system records zero (0) votes for each candidate and on each public question; and (3) see that the system is otherwise in perfect order before the polls open. (IC 3-11-13-27)

The precinct election board shall post the Voter's Bill of Rights in a public place in each polling place on election day. (IC 3-5-8-3)

The precinct election board shall post sample ballots near the entrance to the polls on election day and see that they are available to public inspection throughout the day. (IC 3-11-11-1.9; IC 3-11-13-10; IC 3-11-14-8)

POLLS OPEN, 6 a.m. to 6 p.m., prevailing local time. (IC 3-11-8-8)

The appointments of precinct judge, poll clerk, or sheriff expire at NOON if they were appointed to serve in that precinct election office for the first half of election day. The beginning of the term of a precinct election officer appointed to serve for the last part of election day. (IC 3-6-6-10; IC 3-6-6-11)

DEADLINE, by noon, for certain absent uniform services voters (or the voter's spouse or dependent), not previously registered, to register and vote in the office of the clerk or at another location as designated by resolution of the county election board. (IC 3-7-36-14; IC 3-11-4-3) **STATE FORMS: ABS-1, VRG-11, ABS-11 AND ABS-13**

DEADLINE, by noon, in an absentee ballot central count county, for the clerk (or clerk's agent) to visit the post office to receive voted absentee ballots. Except for certain ballots received from overseas voters, absentee ballots received after noon are considered as arriving as too late and may not be counted. (IC 3-11.5-4-3; IC 3-11.5-4-7; IC 3-11.5-4-10; IC 3-12-1-17)

May 4, 2010 (continued)

DEADLINE, by noon, for the county voter registration office to visit the appropriate post office to accept delivery of mail containing residency confirmation documentation submitted by a first-time Indiana voter who submitted a voter registration application by mail and who has, up to that point, failed to submit residency confirmation documents. The county voter registration office shall immediately notify the county election board of the names of voters who have filed additional residency confirmation documents so that the county election board can send this information to precinct election boards. (IC 3-11-10-11(b))

DEADLINE, by 3 p.m., in a county that counts absentee ballots at a central location, for the circuit court clerk or Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of election and registration *(or their agent)* to deliver a certificate to each precinct setting forth the absentee ballots received by noon on election day. (IC 3-11.5-4-8)

DEADLINE, by 3 p.m., in a county that counts absentee ballots at a central location, for the county voter registration office to notify the county election board about voters who have submitted required additional residency confirmation documents in order for the county election board to transmit a supplemental certified list to the appropriate precinct election board. If the board determines that the supplemental list may not be received before the closing of polls the board shall attempt to contact the precinct election board regarding the content of the supplemental list. (IC 3-11-10-12)

DEADLINE, by 5 p.m., in a county that counts absentee ballots at a central location, for the county election board or the Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration to issue a certificate to a voter whose absentee ballot has been rejected, to permit that voter to vote at the precinct if otherwise qualified to do so. (IC 3-11.5-4-13)

DEADLINE, 6:00 p.m. for the county election board to deliver all absentee ballots to the appropriate polling place in sufficient time to enable the precinct election board to vote the ballots while the polls are still open in counties that count absentee ballots at the precinct, (IC 3-11-10-12) *Note: This deadline does not apply to an absentee ballot mailed by an overseas voter. See entry for May 12, 2010.*

May 4, 2010 (continued)

DEADLINE, before close of polls, for inspector to check precinct poll list and any later certification from the county election board to determine whether an absentee voter has met the residency confirmation documentation requirement. If the voter has met the documentation requirement, then the absentee ballot is processed as an absentee ballot at the polls. If not, and the absentee ballot is otherwise valid, then the voter's absentee ballot is marked as a provisional ballot and returned to the county election board and processed as a provisional ballot. (IC 3-12-3-1; IC 3-12-3-2)

In counties using paper ballots only, all ballots and election materials must be returned to the county election board immediately upon completion of their tabulation. (IC 3-12-2-9)

In a precinct using an electronic voting system, the inspector must announce after the close of the polls that the printout of precinct results is available for inspection by precinct election officials and watchers in precincts. (IC 3-12-3.5-2)

At the close of the polls, the precinct election board must seal all provisional ballots and any spoiled provisional ballots in the required container. The inspector must return the container to the circuit court clerk at the close of the polls. (IC 3-11.7-2-4)

DEADLINE, by midnight, for the inspector and judge of the opposite political party to deliver to the county election board or Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration the certification of the precinct vote count and other election materials. The appointment of a precinct election officer expires when the county election board or the Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration complete the canvass of the precinct. (IC 3-6-6-37)

Wednesday, May 5, 2010

 ${\sf CAN}$ First day that a major political party may fill a candidate vacancy that resulted because no candidate ran in the primary election. (IC 3-13-1-2; IC 3-13-1-7) STATE FORMS: CAN-27 (certificate of selection for federal office), CAN-28 (certificate of selection for state legislative office), CAN-29 (certificate of selection for local office), CAN-30 (call of caucus) and CAN-31 (declaration)

Effective date of an order adopted on or after March 5, 2010, by the board of commissioners of a county with a population of less than 125,000 to establish a board of registration to administer voter registration within the county. (IC 3-7-12-5)

Friday, May 7, 2010

DEADLINE, by noon, for full-service registration agency to respond to an inquiry by a county election board or the Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration indicating whether the agency's records contain any information regarding the registration. If the agency does not respond to the board's inquiry, or if the agency responds that the agency has no record of the alleged registration, the board shall reject the provisional ballot and (1) document on the ballot the inquiry and response, if any, by the agency; and (2) endorse the ballot with the word "Rejected." (IC 3-11.7-5-2)

Tuesday, May 11, 2010

DEADLINE for a county voter registration office to notify the co-directors of the Indiana election division that a voter produced a receipt indicating that the voter had applied to register at the bureau of motor vehicles (or another "full service" office), and was allowed to vote on election day, although the voter's name did not appear on the precinct voter registration list. DEADLINE, by noon, for a circuit court clerk or the Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration to furnish the Indiana election division with a complete list of all state convention delegates elected at the primary election, including the address of each candidate and the United States Congressional district in which each candidate resides. The list may be sent by using the computerized list established under IC 3-7-26.3. (IC 3-8-4-5; IC 3-8-7-5) **STATE FORMS: CEB 23 and 24**

DEADLINE, by noon, for a circuit court clerk or the Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration to send by certified mail or hand-deliver to the Indiana election division a Statement of the Votes Cast for School Board Offices and on Local Public Questions Primary Results. The statement may be sent by using the computerized list established under IC 3-7-26.3. (IC 3-10-1-32; IC 3-10-1-33; IC 3-12-5-1) **STATE FORM: CEB-25**

DEADLINE for the Indiana election division to send a campaign finance delinquency notice to a statewide candidate who failed to file a quarterly report on April 15, 2010. (*Transferred from Saturday, May 15;* IC 3-9-4-14(a)(2)(A))

DEADLINE for the county election board, or the Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration to send a campaign finance delinquency notice to a person who failed to file a pre-primary campaign finance report. (*Transferred from Sunday, May 16;* IC 3-9-4-14(a)(2)(A))

Tuesday, May 18, 2010 Voter Registration Begins

First day after the primary election that an individual may register to vote. (IC 3-7-13-10)

DEADLINE, for a county election board or the Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration to postmark, hand-deliver, or transmit using the computerized list under IC 3-7-26.3, a post-election report concerning the primary election to the Indiana election division. First day that a county election board or the Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration may adopt a resolution providing for the central count of absentee ballots within the county after the primary. (IC 3-11.5-5-1; IC 3-11.5-6-1)

(IC 3-11-14.5-2)

Monday, October 18, 2010

CFA End of campaign finance reporting period for the final pre-election report of a candidate's committee for a statewide office on the 2010 general election ballot (Secretary of State; Auditor of State; Treasurer of State)(See entry for Monday October 25 for the date the report is due to be filed). (IC 3-9-5-6)

Tuesday, October 19, 2010

DEADLINE for a county election board or the Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration to conduct a public test of the ballot card voting systems at the primary election. The public test must ascertain whether the machines will correctly count votes cast for all candidates and on all public questions. CFA Beginning of reporting period for a candidate's committee for a statewide office on the 2010 general election ballot (Secretary of State; Auditor of State; Treasurer of State) to file a supplemental campaign finance report with the Indiana election division to report a large contribution from a contributor that totals at least \$1,000 and is received by the committee after the end of the pre-election reporting period (Monday, October 18) and before the deadline to file the final pre-election report (noon, Tuesday. October 26). The report is to be filed within 48 hours of the receipt of the large contribution. (IC 3-9-5-22) STATE FORM: CFA-11

CFA Beginning of the final quarterly reporting period for a candidate's committee for a statewide office on the 2010 general election ballot (Secretary of State; Auditor of State; Treasurer of State). (IC 3-9-5-6(e))

CAN **DEADLINE**, by noon, prevailing local time, to file a statement with the Indiana election division, a county election board, or the Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration questioning the validity of a certificate of candidate selection to fill a late vacancy on the general election ballot. (IC 3-8-1-2; IC 3-13-2-11) **STATE FORM: CAN-1**

First date, after noon, that a county election board or the Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration may, by majority vote of the board, fill a vacant precinct election office when the appropriate county chairman has made no nomination for the office. (IC 3-6-6-13)

Thursday, October 21, 2010

ABS First day that a voter with disabilities, a confined voter, or a voter caring for a confined person to vote an absentee ballot before a absentee travel board at the voter's location. (IC 3-11-10-25)

Friday, October 22, 2010

ABS **DEADLINE**, for a county voter registration office to receive an application for voter registration from a discharged absent uniformed services voter who returned to Indiana after the close of registration and whose government movement orders dated on after May 18, 2010 for processing before the general election. A copy of the discharge or government movement orders must be presented to the county voter registration office and a voter registration application must be submitted. This registration procedure also applies to the spouse or dependent of the voter. (IC 3-7-36-11) **STATE FORM: VRG-11**

Saturday, October 23, 2010

ABS The office of the circuit court clerk or Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration must be open for at least seven (7) hours to permit absentee voting. However, in a county with a population of less than 20,000, the absentee voter board in the office of the circuit court clerk, after majority vote by the county election board, may reduce absentee voting hours to a minimum of four (4) hours on this date. The list must contain the full name, address, and assigned county identification number of each voter. DEADLINE, in a county using a ballot card voting system where the ballot cards will be tabulated at a central counting location, for the county election board or the Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration to designate a central location for the processing and counting of ballot cards. (IC 3-12-3-2.5)

DEADLINE, for the Lake County board of elections and registration to duplicate, distribute, and cause to be posted copies of official sample ballots to schools, fire stations, county courthouses, and other public buildings in the county. (IC 3-11-14-8)

DEADLINE, in a county having a population of at least 300,000 for the judge of the circuit court to order the county commissioners, the Mayor of Indianapolis or the Lake County boards of elections and registration to provide a suitable room for the canvassing of votes other than a room in the county courthouse. (IC 3-12-4-7)

Monday, October 25, 2010

ABS **DEADLINE**, by midnight, for a circuit court clerk or the Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration to receive a mailed or facsimile transmitted absentee ballot application from a voter who requests to vote **by mail**. (Note: this does not include a voter with disabilities or a confined voter or a voter caring for a confined person who requests that the absentee ballots be delivered to the applicant by an absentee voter board.) DEADLINE, for a county voter registration office to receive an absentee registration application from an absent uniformed services voter or an overseas voter for processing before the general election. (*Transferred from Saturday October 23*; IC 3-7-36-10)

DEADLINE, by noon, for a county election board or the Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration to file a copy of the notice of the general election with the Indiana election division and in the minutes of the board. (*Transferred from Saturday October 23;* IC 3-10-2-2) **STATE FORM: CAN-39**

DEADLINE for a county election board or the Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration to notify county chairmen that sample ballots and pasters are available for inspection. (IC 3-6-5-14)

Tuesday, October 26, 2010

CFA **DEADLINE**, by noon, prevailing local time, for a candidate's committee for a statewide office on the 2010 general election ballot (Secretary of State; Auditor of State; Treasurer of State) to file a **pre-election** campaign finance report with the Indiana election division covering the period from October 1 through October 18. (IC 3-9-5-6) **STATE FORM: CFA-4**

CFA End, at noon, of reporting period for a candidate's committee for a statewide office on the 2010 general election ballot to file a supplemental campaign finance report with the Indiana election division to report a large contribution from a contributor that totals at least \$1,000 and is received by the committee after the end of the pre-election reporting period (October 18) and before the deadline to file the pre-election report (noon, October 26). The report is to be filed within 48 hours of the receipt of the large contribution. (IC 3-9-5-22)

CAN **DEADLINE**, by noon, prevailing local time, for the Indiana election commission, a county election board, or the Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration to resolve any question concerning the validity of an individual's selection as a candidate to fill a late ballot vacancy on the general election ballot. (IC 3-8-1-2; IC 3-13-2-11)

DEADLINE for the Indiana election division, a county election board, or the Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration to receive a certificate of death for a candidate and to order the use of pasters to cover the candidate's name on the ballot, or the printing of new ballots (if the Indiana election commission or the board unanimously find good cause to believe that the candidate has died no certificate of death is necessary). (IC 3-11-3-29.5)

DEADLINE for a county election board or the Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration to certify to the Indiana election division that a public test of an optical scan ballot card voting system or an electronic voting system at the primary election has been conducted in conformity with state law if that test was performed on the last day it could be performed on October 19, 2010. (IC 3-11-13-22(a); IC 3-11-14.5-9) **STATE FORMS: IEC-9 (DRE); IEC-10 (optical scan)**

Thursday, October 28, 2010

DEADLINE, by noon, if a candidate vacancy is filled, for the Indiana election division, a county election board, or the Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration to reprint ballots or print pasters with the successor candidate's name. (IC 3-11-3-29.5)

Saturday, October 30, 2010

ABS The office of the circuit court clerk or Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration must be open for at least seven (7) hours to permit absentee voting. However, in a county with a population of less than 20,000, the absentee voter board in the office of the circuit court clerk, after majority vote by the county election board, may reduce absentee voting hours to a minimum of four (4) hours on this date. (IC 3-11-10-26)

DEADLINE for the circuit court clerk or the Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration to change the polling place for a precinct in the county. The circuit court clerk may change a polling place after this date if it is dangerous or impossible to use the designated polling place. (IC 3-11-8-3.2)

First day an inspector or other authorized member of the precinct election board may pick up ballots and election supplies for the inspector's precinct. (IC 3-11-3-10); IC 3-11.5-4-1)

Sunday, October 31, 2010

CFA 6 a.m., end of the pre-general election supplemental campaign finance reporting period for candidates on the 2010 general election ballot (other than candidates for statewide office). Contributions from a person that total \$1,000 or more received by a candidate on the general election ballot after that time must be reported on the committee's annual campaign finance report. (IC 3-9-5-20.1)

DEADLINE for a precinct inspector or other authorized member of the precinct election board may pick up ballots and election supplies for the inspector's precinct. (IC 3-11-3-10)

DEADLINE, in an absentee ballot central count county for the circuit court clerk or the Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of election and registration to provide a certificate to inspectors stating the names of the voters: (1) to whom absentee ballots were sent or who marked ballots in person; and (2) whose ballots have been received by the county election board under IC 3-11-10. (IC 3-11.5-4-1)

- ABS **DEADLINE**, by noon, for the circuit court clerk or Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration to receive a mailed, faxed, or hand delivered absentee ballot application from a voter with disabilities, a confined voter, or a voter caring for a confined person that requests that the absentee ballots be delivered to the applicant by an **absentee travel board**. (IC 3-11-4-3(3); IC 3-11-10-25)
- ABS **DEADLINE** (by midnight), for a voter with disabilities, a confined voter, or a voter caring for a confined person to vote an absentee ballot before an absentee travel board at the voter's location. (IC 3-11-10-25)
- ABS **DEADLINE**, by noon, for the circuit court clerk or Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration to receive an absentee ballot application from a military or overseas voter who is entitled to return a voted ballot by fax. (IC 3-11-4-3(2))

DEADLINE, by 4 p.m., for a voter who has moved to a different precinct in Indiana not more than 30 days before the general election, to execute a voter registration transfer request in the county voter registration office. This transfer allows the voter to return to the voter's old precinct and vote at that location one final time. (IC 3-10-11-7) **STATE FORM: VRG-4/12**

DEADLINE, by 6 p.m., for a county election board or the Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registrations to deliver the voting system and equipment to each polling place. In precincts using computerized electronic voting systems, the county election board shall have the system put in order, set and adjusted, and ready for use in voting. (IC 3-11-11-1.8; IC 3-11-13-6; IC 3-11-14-13)

DEADLINE for a county election board to conduct a training and educational meeting for inspectors, judges, poll clerks, assistant poll clerks, and sheriffs. Inspectors must attend this meeting. The county election board may require other precinct election officers to attend as well. A county election board may allow an individual to serve as a poll worker if the individual is appointed after the training and educational meeting or the poll worker demonstrates to the county election board that the individual was unable to attend the meeting due to a good cause. DEADLINE, by 5 a.m., for the members of the precinct election board, poll clerks, and sheriffs to meet at the polling place. (IC 3-11-11-2; IC 3-11-13-27; IC 3-11-14-16)

In a precinct using an electronic voting system, each precinct election board must: (1) compare the ballot label on each electronic voting system with the sample ballot to see that it is correct; (2) see that the system records zero (0) votes for each candidate and on each public question; and (3) see that the system is otherwise in perfect order before the polls open. The board then shall certify that the ballot labels and the sample ballots are in agreement. (IC 3-11-14-13; IC 3-11-14-17)

In a precinct using an optical scan ballot card voting system, the precinct election board must (1) Compare the ballot cards used in the marking device with the sample ballots furnished and determine whether the names, numbers, and letters are in agreement; (2) see that the system records zero (0) votes for each candidate and on each public question; and (3) see that the system is otherwise in perfect order before the polls open. (IC 3-11-13-27)

The precinct election board shall post the Voter's Bill of Rights in a public place in each polling place on election day. (IC 3-5-8-3).

The precinct election board shall post sample ballots near the entrance to the polls on election day and see that they are available to public inspection throughout the day. (IC 3-11-11-1.9; IC 3-11-13-10; IC 3-11-14-8)

5:30 a.m. a challenger, pollbook holder, or watcher may enter into the polling place. (IC 3-6-7-5, IC 3-6-8-4; IC 3-6-10-5.5; IC 3-11-8-15, IC 3-11-8-16)

Each full service license branch must remain open from 6:00 a.m. local time until 6:00 p.m. local time, solely for the purpose of issuing driver's licenses and state identification cards. (IC 9-16-1-7)

POLLS OPEN, 6 a.m. to 6 p.m., prevailing local time. (IC 3-11-8-8)

The appointments of precinct judge, poll clerk, or sheriff expire at NOON if they were appointed to serve in that precinct election office for the first half of election day. The beginning of the term of a precinct election officer appointed to serve for the last part of election day. (IC 3-6-6-10; IC 3-6-6-11)

DEADLINE, by noon, for certain absent uniform services voters (or the voter's spouse or dependent), not previously registered, to register and vote in the office of the clerk or at another location as designated by resolution of the county election board. (IC 3-7-36-11; IC 3-7-36-14; IC 3-11-4-3) **STATE FORMS: ABS-1, VRG-11, ABS-11 AND ABS-13**

DEADLINE, by noon, in a county that counts absentee ballots at a central location, for the clerk (or clerk's agent) to visit the post office to receive voted absentee ballots. Except for certain ballots received from overseas voters, absentee ballots received after noon in a county that counts absentee ballots at a central location are considered as arriving as too late and may not be counted. (IC 3-11.5-4-3; IC 3-11.5-4-7; IC 3-11.5-4-10; IC 3-12-1-17)

Tuesday, November 2, 2010 (continued)

DEADLINE, by noon, for the county voter registration office to visit the appropriate post office to accept delivery of mail containing residency confirmation documentation submitted by a first-time Indiana voter who submitted a voter registration application by mail and who has, up to that point, failed to submit residency confirmation documents. The county voter registration office shall immediately notify the county election board of the names of voters who have filed additional residency confirmation documents so that the county election board can send this information to precinct election boards. (IC 3-11-10-11(b))

In a county that counts absentee ballots at the precinct, the circuit court clerk or Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections must certify to the precinct election board a list of persons who have submitted residency confirmation documentation after the preparation of the certified list of registered voters and, as a result, are entitled to have the voter's absentee ballot counted if the ballot otherwise complies with law. (IC 3-11-10-11; IC 3-11-10-12)

DEADLINE, for a voter who returned an absentee ballot and is required to submit additional residency confirmation documents, to file the additional documents with the county voter registration office for the ballot to be counted. (IC 3-11-4-18; IC 3-11-10-16; IC 3-11-10-16.5; IC 3-11.5-4-12; IC 3-11.7-5-2(c))

DEADLINE, by 3 p.m., in a county that counts absentee ballots at a central location, for the circuit court clerk or Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of election and registration *(or their agent)* to deliver a certificate to each precinct setting forth the absentee ballots received by noon on election day. (IC 3-11.5-4-8)

DEADLINE, by 3 p.m., in a county that counts absentee ballots at a central location, for the county voter registration office to notify the county election board about voters who have submitted required additional residency confirmation documents in order for the county election board to transmit a supplemental certified list to the appropriate precinct election board. If the board determines that the supplemental list may not be received before the closing of polls the board shall attempt to contact the precinct election board regarding the content of the supplemental list. (IC 3-11-10-12)

DEADLINE, by 5 p.m., in a county that counts absentee ballots at a central location, for the county election board or the Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration to issue a certificate to a voter whose absentee ballot has been rejected, to permit that voter to vote at the precinct if otherwise qualified to do so. (IC 3-11.5-4-13)

DEADLINE, 6:00 p.m. for the county election board to deliver all absentee ballots to the appropriate polling place in sufficient time to enable the precinct election board to vote the ballots while the polls are still open In counties that count absentee ballots at the precinct, (IC 3-11-10-12) *Note: This deadline does not apply to an absentee ballot mailed by an overseas voter. See entry for November 12, 2010.*

Tuesday, November 2, 2010 (continued)

DEADLINE, before close of polls, in a county that counts ballots at the precinct, for inspector to check precinct poll list and any later certification from the county election board to determine whether an absentee voter has met the residency confirmation documentation requirement. If the voter has met the documentation requirement, then the absentee ballot is processed as an absentee ballot at the polls. If not, and the absentee ballot is otherwise valid, then the voter's absentee ballot is marked as a provisional ballot and returned to the county election board and processed as a provisional ballot. (IC 3-11-10-16.5)

In counties using a ballot card voting system where votes cast at the precinct on election day are tabulated at a central location, all ballot cards must be sealed and delivered to the canvassing location immediately after the polls are closed and the number of ballot cards are counted and compared with the number of voters shown on the poll lists. (IC 3-12-3-1; IC 3-12-3-2)

In counties using paper ballots only, all ballots and election materials must be returned to the county election board immediately upon completion of their tabulation. (IC 3-12-2-9)

In a precinct using an electronic voting system, the inspector must announce after the close of the polls that the printout of precinct results is available for inspection by precinct election officials and watchers in precincts. (IC 3-12-3.5-2)

At the close of the polls, the precinct election board must seal all provisional ballots and any spoiled provisional ballots in the required container. The inspector must return the container to the circuit court clerk at the close of the polls. (IC 3-11.7-2-4)

DEADLINE, by midnight, for the inspector and judge of the opposite political party to deliver to the county election board or Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration the certification of the precinct vote count and other election materials. (IC 3-12-2-7; IC 3-12-3-10; IC 3-12-3.5-4)

The appointment of a precinct election officer expires when the county election board or the Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration complete the canvass of the precinct. (IC 3-6-6-37)

Wednesday, November 3, 2010

NEW TERM OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY BEGINS. (IC 2-2.1-1-1)

Effective date of an order adopted on or after September 3, 2010, by the board of commissioners of a county with a population of less than 125,000 to establish a board of registration to administer voter registration within the county. (IC 3-7-12-5)

Friday, November 5, 2010

DEADLINE, by noon, for a full-service registration agency to respond to an inquiry by a county election board or the Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration indicating whether the agency's records contain any information regarding the registration. If the agency does not respond to the board's inquiry, or if the agency responds that the agency has no record of the alleged registration, the board shall reject the provisional ballot and (1) document on the ballot the inquiry and response, if any, by the agency; and (2) endorse the ballot with the word "Rejected". (IC 3-11.7-5-2)

Tuesday, November 9, 2010

DEADLINE for a county voter registration office to notify the co-directors of the Indiana election division that a voter produced a receipt indicating that the voter had applied to register at the bureau of motor vehicles (or another "full service" office), and was allowed to vote on election day, although the voter's name did not appear on the precinct voter registration list. (IC 3-7-48-9)

Thursday, November 11, 2010

VETERANS DAY (observed)
Indiana election division closed

Friday, November 12, 2010

DEADLINE, by noon, for a voter who voted a provisional ballot because the voter was unable or declined to present a photo identification to produce photo identification to the county election board or circuit court clerk and sign an affidavit indicating that the voter is the same person who cast the provisional ballot on election day to satisfy the photo identification requirement. The voter may also satisfy the photo identification requirement by appearing at the office of the county election board or circuit court clerk and signing an affidavit indicating that the voter is the same person who cast the provisional ballot on election day and that the voter cannot obtain a photo identification because the voter is either: (1) indigent and unable to obtain a photo identification without the payment of a fee; or (2) has a religious objection to being photographed. (IC 3-11.7-5-1; IC 3-11.7-5-2.5)

DEADLINE, by noon, for a county election board or the Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections to make a determination of whether or not to count a provisional ballot. Immediately upon completion of the provisional ballot count, the provisional ballot counters must make a certificate showing the total number of provisional ballots counted for each candidate and on each public question. (IC 3-11.7-5-1; IC 3-11.7-5-28)

Friday, November 12, 2010 (continued)

ABS **DEADLINE**, by noon, for a county election board or the Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections to receive an absentee ballot cast by mail by an overseas voter. The absentee ballot is not considered to be arriving too late if the absentee ballot envelope is postmarked no later than election day (November 2, 2010) and the board, by unanimous vote of its entire membership, determines that the postmark date complies with this requirement. If the board is unable to determine the postmark date, the absentee ballot may not be counted. (IC 3-12-1-17)

Monday, November 15, 2010

DEADLINE, by noon, for a circuit court clerk or the Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration to prepare a statement specifying the number of votes cast: (1) for each candidate for federal office, statewide office, or state legislative office; (2) for each candidate for a judicial office; (3) for each candidate for prosecuting attorney; (4) for each candidate for a circuit or county office commissioned by the governor (circuit court clerk; county auditor; county recorder; county treasurer; county sheriff, county coroner; county surveyor); (5) for each candidate for any other local office declared elected by the county election board or Lake County board of elections and registration; (6) for and against the ratification of each state constitutional amendment; (7) for and against the retention of each judge of the court of appeals; and (8) for and against the retention of any judge in Lake County or St. Joseph County. The circuit court clerk or the Lake and Tippecanoe County boards of elections and registration shall send the statement by certified mail, return receipt requested or hand-deliver the statement to the Indiana election division. The statement may be sent by using the computerized list established under IC 3-7-26.3.
